<p>Resource Officers & Other Personnel</p>	<p>Mandatory School Resource Officers in every public school or 1 resource officer per 1000 students; must be sworn sheriff's deputies or police officers; staffing level to be set by sheriff's office</p> <p>Authorize sheriffs' departments to train additional school personnel or reserve law enforcement officers students if requested by the local school board</p>	<p>Improve school security capabilities through additional school resource and security officers</p> <p>A "marshal" program to enhance safety and security in schools through the use of law enforcement trained and screened school personnel who function as part of school security teams</p>	<p>Liability, Insurance, Bargaining issues and costs if school personnel is used</p> <p>Some authority may be transferred from school district to sheriff's office</p>
<p>Safe Schools Policy and Funding Issues</p>	<p>Increase Safe Schools allocation and authorize funds to be used for school safety needs, including hardening measures like metal detectors, bullet-proof glass, steel doors, etc.</p> <p>Directs the Florida DOE, in conjunction with FDLE, to provide minimum school safety and security standards by 7/1/18</p> <p>School safety plans must be submitted to County Sheriff's Office by 7/15/18 for approval; Once approved by the county sheriff's department, in consultation with local police jurisdictions, plans can be submitted by the school district to DOE for schools to receive any state funds</p>	<p>Increase Safe Schools allocation</p> <p>Establish safe school and security standards</p> <p>Review school safety and security plans</p>	<p>Would use operating funds for capital outlay purposes</p> <p>Some authority may be transferred from school district to sheriff's office</p>

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<p>Safe Schools Policy and Funding issues</p>	<p>Require each school district that receives a Safe Schools Allocation to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the local sheriff's office, DJJ, DCF, FDLE, and community behavioral health providers for sharing information to coordinate services for prevention/ intervention services and strategies</p> <p>Require each school to have a threat assessment team – a teacher, a local law enforcement officer, a human resource officer, a DCF employee, DJJ employee, and the principal – to meet monthly to review any potential threats</p> <p>Establish a new, anonymous K-12 “See Something, Say Something” statewide, with dedicated hotline, website, and mobile app</p> <p>Require crisis intervention training for all school personnel. This training must be completed before the 2018 school start</p> <p>Mandatory active shooter training for faculty and students</p> <p>School districts must use all capital outlay funds received from taxpayers for school hardening before it can be spent on any other capital outlay projects</p>	<p>Codify and enhance the activities of the multiagency network for students with emotional and behavioral disabilities</p> <p>implement a school safety specialist training program, and update risk assessment procedures.</p> <p>Require each school district to designate a school safety specialist and each school to establish a threat assessment team to provide a coordinated approach to evaluating and responding to students who pose a threat of violence.</p> <p>Require emergency drills for active shooter and hostage situations involving students, school personnel, and law enforcement experts.</p>	<p>Public records and privacy issues</p>
<p>Review of prior incidents</p>		<p>Establishes Commission on School Safety & Security within FDLE to investigate system failures in the Parkland shooting and prior incidents</p>	<p>Commission includes representatives of schools</p>

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Mental Health Services	<p>Establish funding to require access to dedicated mental health counselors to provide direct counseling services to students at every school; with these counselors cannot serve dual roles, such as teaching or academic advising</p> <p>Expand mental health service teams statewide to serve youth and young adults with early or serious mental illness</p> <p>Require every sheriffs' office to have a DCF case manager embedded in their department to solely work as a crisis welfare worker – 67 additional DCF employees by 7/15/18</p> <p>Provide law enforcement and mental health coordination matching grants to allow sheriffs to establish special law enforcement teams to coordinate with DCF case managers.</p>	<p>Increase funding for mental health training, screening, counseling and services in schools.</p> <p>Remove barriers preventing school district and law enforcement authorities from referring students appropriately to mental health services or law enforcement.</p>	Public records and privacy issues
Firearms, Weapons, and Threats	<p>Require all individuals to be 21 or older to purchase firearms, with exemptions for military and law enforcement</p> <p>Ban purchase or sale of bump stocks.</p> <p>Restrict gun purchase and possession for mentally ill individuals under the Baker Act</p> <p>Create the “Violent Threat Restraining Order” which will allow a court to prohibit a violent or mentally ill person from purchasing or possessing a firearm under certain conditions.</p>	<p>Require all individuals to be 21 or older to purchase firearms, with exemptions for military and law enforcement</p> <p>Ban purchase or sale of bump stocks.</p> <p>Restrict gun purchase and possession for mentally ill individuals under the Baker Act</p> <p>Three-day waiting period for all gun purchases to allow for “cooling off period and sufficient time for more thorough background check</p>	

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Firearms, Weapons, and Threats <i>(Continued)</i>	Prohibit a person from possessing or purchasing a firearm if they are subject to an injunction for protection against stalking or acts of violence Establish enhanced criminal penalties for threats to schools, such as social media threats of shootings or bombings		
Funding	\$500 million \$450 for school resource officers \$50 for mental health services	Not specified, but total is expected to be in excess of \$400 million
