

Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Education Budget Highlights – prepared 1/28/2020

The <u>Senate Education Subcommittee</u> rolled out the Education budget proposal for FY 2020-2021 today.

Note: The <u>House PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee</u> is expected to meet tomorrow and roll-out the Chair's 2020-2021 budget.

Some highlights of the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Education (Chair Kelli Stargel) proposal include:

- \$23.2 billion total for Education (excluding local funds)
- \$16.8 billion PreK-12 Education (excluding non-recurring funds)
- \$22.6 billion for public schools (\$762.8 million increase over the current year)
- FEFP increases total funds per FTE \$181 or 2.37%
- \$40 increase BSA
- \$500 million for new teacher salary increase
- \$25 million (increase) for youth mental health

With regard to the new salary increase allocation in the the FEFP:

- Allocated funds are based on each districts share of total base funds
- Requires districts to use 80% of total allocation to increase minimum teacher salaries to the Governor's goal of \$47,500.00. The intent would be to meet this goal over the next several years.
- Allows districts, if the \$47,500.00 goal is met, within the 80% and minimum salary is increased by 5%, to spend the remaining funds on other teachers, instructional personnel and salary increases
- Allows districts to spend 20% of total allocations on other teachers/instructional personnel, such as veteran teachers, to give them a salary increase pursuant to the local discretion
