Additionally, we are sharing your concerns regarding the need for shelters to relocate remaining evacuees, the need to replenish school facility supplies that were used during shelter use, and concerns regarding school make up days.

THANK YOU to each of you and your school district personnel who are #FLpublicschoolheroes. This week, they are showing time and time again across the state why public-school staff members are so vital to our communities. Because public schools represent the heart of a community and serve as an integral element of normalcy, school districts are looked to for guidance during times of chaos and stress.
