<u>39</u>	<u>Gaetz</u>	<u>Article II</u> , Section 8 <u>Article V</u> , Section 13 <u>Article XII</u> , New Section	Establishes certain restrictions for specified public officers and employees, including a school board member or superintendent, regarding lobbying another person or entity before certain government bodies.	<u>Text</u>	Referred to: <u>Ethics & Elections</u> <u>General Provisions</u> Status: On 2 nd Reading
<u>93</u>	<u>Martinez</u>	<u>Article IX</u> , Section 4	Authorizes the school board of a high-performing school district to choose to be designated as a charter district that provides exemption from all provisions of the Florida K-20 Education Code in the same manner as a charter school.	<u>Text</u>	Referred to: <u>Education</u> <u>Local Government</u> Status: On 2 nd Reading

NOTE:

- Proposals 74, 76, 77,78,79, 84, 85, 86, and 87 serve as “shell” proposals – i.e. the text of each of these proposals states “The Constitution Revision Commission intends to revise provisions in Article ____.” Proposal 76 specifies intent to revise Article IX. These “shell” proposals may be used to create a new proposal, combine existing proposals, or for other purposes. These proposals remain viable for use by the full Commission.
